- Assisted nine young women in locating / maintaining social service assistance programs.
- Worked with Social Service Agencies to insure participants’ smooth transition to new housing program.
- We were the Recipient of the “2012 African Americans Who Make a Difference Award,” from the Denver Urban Spectrum.

1. We provide participants with affordable, safe housing in a apartment setting where they will be expected to master transitional living skills, as a result of the range of interventions offered by YCBA/YCBAT, Inc.
2. We equip young women with specific skills, values, and competencies that result in employment in high growth, high income industries.
3. We place focus on enabling participants to meet basic survival needs as they explore options and opportunities to improve their lives.
4. We guide young women in developing “Individualized Growth Plans” that identify measurable outcomes for educational, interpersonal, and rewarding community involvement.
5. We facilitate changes in the lives of participants so that they may live lives of in independence and interdependence.
6. We insure that all participants achieve their high school diploma/GED, and assist them with getting into post secondary education/vocational training.
